(1) periodically publish an updated version of the State Plumbing Code; and

(2) make available on request of any person a copy of the State Plumbing Code for a reasonable fee.

(a) A county shall:

(1) enforce the State Plumbing Code; or

(2) adopt and enforce a local plumbing code that meets or exceeds the minimum standards of the State Plumbing Code for the proper design, acceptable installation, and adequate maintenance of plumbing systems.

(b) Unless the Board determines that a county is adequately enforcing the State Plumbing Code or a local plumbing code that meets or exceeds the minimum standards of the State Plumbing Code, the Board shall enforce the State Plumbing Code in that county.

(c) The Board may make a cooperative agreement with a county for the county to enforce:

(1) the State Plumbing Code; or

(2) if the county has adopted a local plumbing code, that code.

(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, a person who builds or remodels a building or structure shall ensure installation, in the building or structure, of fixtures and devices that are required by and meet the standards for approval as set out in § 12-205(D) OF THIS SUBTITLE AND the State Plumbing Code or any applicable local plumbing code.
