

in the State's emergency medical response system; the proposed reimbursement schedule for State MEDEVAC scene transports and interhospital transfers; and the protocols which delineate what types of medical personnel should be present on any State MEDEVAC flight.

SECTION 30. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Sections 28 and 29 of this Act shall take effect contingent on the failure to enact separate legislation for Fiscal Year 1993 that imposes a surcharge of \$8 per year for each motor vehicle registered, and if such legislation is enacted, Sections 28 and 29 of this Act shall be null and void without the necessity of further action by the General Assembly.

SECTION 31. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the laws of Maryland read as follows:

(D) (1) IN THIS SUBSECTION, "BASIC COST" AS TO EACH COUNTY, MEANS THE AVERAGE AMOUNT SPENT BY THE COUNTY FROM COUNTY, STATE, AND FEDERAL SOURCES FOR THE PUBLIC EDUCATION OF A NONHANDICAPPED CHILD. "BASIC COST" DOES NOT INCLUDE AMOUNTS SPECIFICALLY ALLOCATED AND SPENT FOR IDENTIFIABLE COMPENSATORY PROGRAMS FOR DISADVANTAGED CHILDREN.

(2) AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPHS (3) AND (4) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE STATE AND THE COUNTIES SHALL SHARE COLLECTIVELY IN THE COST OF EDUCATING CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES IN NONPUBLIC PROGRAMS UNDER § 8-409 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

(3) (1) SUBJECT TO THE LIMITATION UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, FOR EACH OF THESE CHILDREN DOMICILED IN THE COUNTY, THE COUNTY SHALL CONTRIBUTE FOR EACH PLACEMENT THE SUM OF:

1. THE LOCAL SHARE OF THE BASIC COST;

2. AN ADDITIONAL AMOUNT EQUAL TO 200 PERCENT OF THE BASIC COST; AND

3. AN ADDITIONAL AMOUNT EQUAL TO 20 PERCENT OF THE APPROVED COST OR REIMBURSEMENT IN EXCESS OF THE SUM OF ITEMS 1 AND 2 OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH.
