- [(viii)] (IX) a representative of the Maryland Chiefs of Police, appointed by the Governor;
- [(ix)] (X) the Secretary of the Department of Human Resources or the Secretary's designee;
- [(x)] (XI) the Secretary of the Department of Juvenile Services or the Secretary's designee;
- [(xi)] (XII) the Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional Services or the Secretary's designee; and
- [(xii)] (XIII) the EXECUTIVE Director [of the Governor's Office of Justice Assistance] or the EXECUTIVE Director's designee, AS AN EX OFFICIO MEMBER.
 - (b) (1) The term of an appointed member is 5 years.
- (2) The terms of appointed members are staggered as required by the terms provided for members of the Board on July 1, 1988.
- (3) At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
- (4) A member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
- (c) The Governor may remove a member for incompetence or misconduct. [6.5–203.] 9–1705.

Subject to the authority of the [Attorney General] EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, the Board shall have the following powers and duties:

- (1) to render each year to the [Attorney General] GOVERNOR a written report of its activities, including the administration of the [Maryland Victims of Crime] Fund;
 - (2) to monitor service needs of victims;
- (3) to advise the [Attorney General] GOVERNOR on the needs of victims; and
- (4) (i) to recommend the appointment of the Victim Services Coordinator to the [Attorney General] EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR; and
- (ii) to review and approve Victim Services Coordinator plans, annual reports, and the implementation, operation, and revision of programs by the Victim Services Coordinator; and
- (5) To approve or disapprove the grant applications submitted by the Office of Justice [Assistance] ADMINISTRATION.
