automatically renominated for up to two consecutive terms; specifying that certain staff is unclassified; requiring the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene to determine certain job classifications and grades for certain staff; authorizing the Board to enter a certain place of business or public premises under certain circumstances; providing certain penalties; requiring applicants to have additional postgraduate training under certain conditions; requiring physicians to practice only in the name in which the license is issued; requiring physicians to notify the Board of certain changes; increasing a certain penalty; authorizing the Board to offer certain complainants and licensees the opportunity to mediate certain disputes under certain circumstances; authorizing the Board to contract with certain persons for a certain purpose; extending the time within which the Board should dispose of certain complaints; authorizing the use of certain fees for certain purposes; altering certain disciplinary grounds; adding grounds for discipline for failure to cooperate with a Board investigation; authorizing the Board to issue advisory opinions in certain cases; repealing certain provisions relating to aviation trauma technicians; authorizing the Board to impose fines under certain circumstances; authorizing certain disclosure to the public and to the Governor and the Secretary of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, under certain circumstances; altering the requirement that all records be expunged following a dismissal of disciplinary charges; requiring the Board to provide certain information on certain cases to certain persons under certain circumstances; extending the termination date of the Board; requiring the Department to submit certain additional information as part of a certain report; providing a certain contingency for certain provisions of this Act; altering certain provisions relating to the examination of medical radiation technologists or nuclear medical technologists; authorizing the Physician Assistant Advisory Committee to interview applicants; and generally relating to the State Board of Physician Quality Assurance.
