

(iv) Providing other information deemed necessary by the Board or the Committee;

(2) Submit to the Board the fee set by the Board; and

(3) Comply with all other requirements established by the Board.

(c) The Committee shall:

(1) Evaluate the qualifications of the physician assistant for delegated medical acts to be performed under the job description; AND

[(2) Conduct a personal interview of the physician assistant and the supervising physician; and

(3)] (2) Recommend to the Board the approval, rejection, or modification of any application for a job description.

(D) THE COMMITTEE MAY CONDUCT A PERSONAL INTERVIEW OF THE PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT AND THE SUPERVISORY PHYSICIAN.

[(d)] (E) On review of the Committee's recommendation, the Board:

(1) May approve, modify, or deny a request for certification; and

(2) Shall notify the physician assistant in writing of the reasons for the Board's decision.

[(e)] (F) The physician assistant shall file and obtain the Board's approval of an amended job description before any substantial change occurs in:

(1) The delegated medical acts;

(2) The extent of supervision provided; or

(3) The practice setting.

[(f)] (G) (1) A job description approved under this title shall be reviewed as a component of the certificate renewal process established under § 15-307 of this title.

(2) Expiration of a certificate shall result in expiration of a job description.

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SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department, on or before January 1 of each year, shall submit a report to the Legislative Policy Committee that contains the following information for the previous year:

1. The number of physicians investigated under each of the disciplinary grounds enumerated under § [14-504] 14-404 of the Health Occupations Article;

2. The average length of the time spent investigating allegations brought against physicians under each of the disciplinary grounds enumerated under § [14-504] 14-404 of the Health Occupations Article;
