

3. The number of cases not completed within [1 year] 18 MONTHS and the reasons for the failure to complete the cases in [1 year] 18 MONTHS;
4. The number of physicians who were reprimanded or placed on probation, or who had their licenses suspended or revoked;
5. The number of unresolved allegations pending before the Board;
6. The number and nature of allegations filed with the Board concerning cardiac rescue technicians, aviation trauma technicians, emergency medical technicians, medical radiation technicians, and physician assistants; [and]
7. The adequacy of current Board staffing in meeting the workload of the Board;
8. A DETAILED EXPLANATION OF THE CRITERIA USED TO ACCEPT AND REJECT CASES FOR PROSECUTION; AND
9. THE NUMBER OF CASES PROSECUTED AND DISMISSED EACH YEAR AND ON WHAT GROUNDS.

**Chapter 440 of the Acts of 1988, as amended
by Chapter 5 and Chapter 471 of the Acts of 1989**

SECTION 2. AND BE FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Board of Physician Quality Assurance shall be authorized to issue a certificate of temporary authority to any individual employed as a medical radiation technologist or a nuclear medical technologist as of August 1, 1988. A certificate of temporary certification issued in accordance with the provisions of this Act shall be valid until February 1, [1992] 1993.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Board of Physician Quality Assurance shall develop, by February 1, 1990, a permanent certification examination that is designed to evaluate minimum cognitive skills and technical proficiency for uncertified individuals employed, as of August 1, 1988, OR FOR 2 CONSECUTIVE YEARS SINCE 1985, as medical radiation technologists or nuclear medical technologists. The test developed under this section shall be utilized by the Board until February 1, [1992] 1993.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Health Occupations

14-404.

(a) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 14-405 of this subtitle, the Board, on the affirmative vote of a majority of its full authorized membership, may reprimand any licensee, place any licensee on probation, or suspend or revoke a license if the licensee:

(19) Grossly [and willfully overcharges for professional] OVER UTILIZES HEALTH CARE services;
