

(5) A PAYROLL;

(6) A PRODUCTION REPORT OR OTHER RECORD THAT RELATES TO EQUIPMENT, PERSONNEL, OR SALES; AND

(7) A VOUCHER.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 15B, § 1(c) and the introductory phrase of that section.

In the introductory language of this section, the former alternative defined term "[r]ecords" is deleted as unnecessary since only the more specific and accurate defined term "business record" is used in this subtitle.

Also in the introductory language of this subsection, the former reference to "other business papers" is deleted as unnecessary in light of the word "includes". Art. 1, § 30 of the Code provides that "includes" is by way of illustration and not by way of limitation.

Item (6) of this section is revised to clarify that the former reference to "such records" referred to records of equipment, personnel, or sale.

#### 1-302. SCOPE OF SUBTITLE.

THIS SUBTITLE APPLIES TO EACH PRIVATE BUSINESS, OCCUPATION, PRIVATE INSTITUTION, AND PROFESSION, WHETHER OR NOT CARRIED ON FOR PROFIT.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 15B, § 1(a). It is revised as a scope provision, rather than a definition of "[b]usiness", for clarity.

The former word "calling" is deleted as included in the words "occupation" and "profession".

#### 1-303. EFFECT OF SUBTITLE.

THIS SUBTITLE DOES NOT DIMINISH THE AUTHORITY OF AN OFFICER OF THE STATE TO ALLOW THE DESTRUCTION OF A BUSINESS RECORD.
