SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

9 - 1307.

(c) A county board of health may establish a permit fee to defray county expenses in inspecting <u>AND TESTING</u> wells. The fee may be charged before a permit required under § 9-1306 of this subtitle is issued. The fee may not exceed [\$40] \$80 per well. <u>A PERMIT SHALL BE VALID FOR A PERIOD OF 12 MONTHS FROM THE DATE OF ISSUANCE BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH.</u>

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1992.
