(iii) A holder of a Class 6 pub-brewery license in Baltimore City may not sell malt beverages to any retail alcoholic beverages licensee in the State of Maryland for the purpose of a subsequent sale or distribution of that malt beverage under the retail license.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1992.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments

304.

- (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
- (2) "Athletic facility" means any commercial health club, public recreation center, weight training gym, school gymnasium, or other establishment operated primarily for the exercise, physical fitness, athletic training, or physical education of the individuals using the facility.
 - (3) "Human growth hormone" means:
 - (i) Somatrem, somatropin, and any of their analogs; or
- (ii) Any substance labeled as being or containing somatrem or somatropin and any one of their analogs.
