(3) The panel may:

(i) Solicit additional data that address a particular criterion; and

(ii) Hold public hearings on each subject under review.

(4) Any person or organizations may submit data to the panel regarding a mandated health insurance benefit, nondiscrimination provision, and beneficiary or length of coverage provisions under review addressing [the following:

(i) Proof and documentation as to the effectiveness of the procedure, treatment, or service;

(ii) Quantification of the estimated social and fiscal costs and benefits of the legislative proposal or statute, including the impact on:

1. The total health care costs in the State;

2. The insurance premiums in the State;
