

2-203.

- (a) From among its members, the Board annually shall elect a chairman.
- (b) The manner of election of officers shall be as the Board determines.

2-204.

(a) A majority of the full authorized membership of the Board, WITH AT LEAST 1 MEMBER OF EACH PROFESSION REGULATED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THIS TITLE BEING PRESENT, is a quorum to do business.

(b) The Board shall meet at least once a year, at the times and places that it determines.

(c) In accordance with the State budget, each member of the Board is entitled to:

(1) Compensation, at a rate determined by the Board, for each day on which the member is engaged in the duties of the member's office; and

(2) Reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations.

(d) The Board may employ a staff in accordance with the State budget.

2-205.

(A) In addition to the powers and duties set forth elsewhere in this title, the Board has the following powers and duties:

(1) To adopt rules and regulations to carry out the provisions of this title;

(2) To adopt and publish [a code] CODES of ethics for the practice of audiology, THE PROVISION OF HEARING AID SERVICES, AND THE PRACTICE OF SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY;

(3) To adopt an official seal;

(4) To hold hearings and keep records and minutes necessary for the orderly conduct of business;

(5) To issue a list annually of the names of all individuals licensed by the Board to practice audiology, PROVIDE HEARING AID SERVICES, AND PRACTICE SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY; and

(6) To send any notice that the Board is required to give to a licensee under this title to the last known address given to the Board by the licensee.

(B) THE BOARD SHALL REQUIRE, BY REGULATION, PERIODIC CALIBRATION OF AUDIOMETRIC EQUIPMENT USED BY LICENSED AUDIOLOGISTS AND HEARING AID DEALERS.

(C) THE BOARD MAY INSPECT THE FACILITIES USED BY LICENSED HEARING AID DEALERS.
