

[(iv)] (V) To a volunteer while working in free speech and hearing screening programs; OR

(VI) TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS FITTING HEARING AIDS UNDER:

1. AN ACADEMIC CURRICULUM OF AN ACCREDITED INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION; OR

2. A PROGRAM CONDUCTED BY A PUBLIC, CHARITABLE, OR NONPROFIT INSTITUTION OR ORGANIZATION THAT IS SUPPORTED PRIMARILY BY VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS.

(2) The Board may allow an audiologist, HEARING AID DEALER, OR SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGIST licensed in another state to practice audiology, PROVIDE HEARING AID SERVICES, OR PRACTICE SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY in this State without a license if the audiologist, HEARING AID DEALER, OR SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGIST:

(i) Recently has become a resident of this State; and

(ii) Has an application for a license pending before the Board.

2-302.

(a) To qualify for a license TO PRACTICE AUDIOLOGY, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the requirements of this section.

(b) The applicant shall be of good moral character.

(c) The applicant shall:

(1) Hold a master's degree or its equivalent in audiology from an educational institution which incorporates the academic course work and the minimum hours of supervised training required by the [rules and] regulations adopted by the Board; and

(2) Have completed the period of supervised [post-graduate] POSTGRADUATE professional practice in audiology as specified by the [rules and] regulations adopted by the Board.

(d) Except as otherwise provided in this title, the applicant shall pass an examination given or approved by the Board under this subtitle.

(A) TO QUALIFY FOR A LICENSE TO PROVIDE HEARING AID SERVICES, AN APPLICANT SHALL BE AN INDIVIDUAL WHO MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.

(B) THE APPLICANT SHALL BE OF GOOD MORAL CHARACTER.

(C) THE APPLICANT SHALL BE AT LEAST 18 YEARS OLD.
