(VI) TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS FITTING HEARING AIDS UNDER:

- 1. AN ACADEMIC CURRICULUM OF AN ACCREDITED INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION; OR
- 2. A PROGRAM CONDUCTED BY A PUBLIC, CHARITABLE, OR NONPROFIT INSTITUTION OR ORGANIZATION THAT IS SUPPORTED PRIMARILY BY VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS.
- (2) The Board may allow an audiologist, HEARING AID DEALER, OR SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGIST licensed in another state to practice audiology, PROVIDE HEARING AID SERVICES, OR PRACTICE SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY in this State without a license if the audiologist, HEARING AID DEALER, OR SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGIST:
 - (i) Recently has become a resident of this State; and
 - (ii) Has an application for a license pending before the Board.

2-302.

- (a) To qualify for a license TO PRACTICE AUDIOLOGY, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the requirements of this section.
 - (b) The applicant shall be of good moral character.
 - (c) The applicant shall:
- (1) Hold a master's degree or its equivalent in audiology from an educational institution which incorporates the academic course work and the minimum hours of supervised training required by the [rules and] regulations adopted by the Board; and
- (2) <u>Have completed the period of supervised [post-graduate]</u> <u>POSTGRADUATE professional practice in audiology as specified by the [rules and] regulations adopted by the Board.</u>
- (d) Except as otherwise provided in this title, the applicant shall pass an examination given or approved by the Board under this subtitle.

- (A) TO QUALIFY FOR A LICENSE TO PROVIDE HEARING AID SERVICES, AN APPLICANT SHALL BE AN INDIVIDUAL WHO MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.
 - (B) THE APPLICANT SHALL BE OF GOOD MORAL CHARACTER.
 - (C) THE APPLICANT SHALL BE AT LEAST 18 YEARS OLD.
