

(1) Pays the application fee required by the Board under § 2-303 of this subtitle; and

(2) Provides adequate evidence that the applicant:

(i) Meets the qualifications otherwise required by this title; and

(ii) Became licensed in the other state after meeting in that or any other state requirements that are at least equivalent to the licensing requirements of this State.

2-306.

The Board shall issue a license to any applicant who:

(1) Meets the requirements of this title; and

(2) Pays the license fee set by the Board.

2-307.

A license TO PRACTICE AUDIOLOGY authorizes the licensee to practice audiology while the license is effective.

2-307.1.

A LICENSE TO PROVIDE HEARING AID SERVICES AUTHORIZES THE LICENSEE TO PROVIDE HEARING AID SERVICES WHILE THE LICENSE IS EFFECTIVE.

2-307.2.

A LICENSE TO PRACTICE SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY AUTHORIZES THE LICENSEE TO PRACTICE SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY WHILE THE LICENSE IS EFFECTIVE.

2-308.

(a) Except as provided for a limited license in §§ 2-310, 2-310.1, AND 2-310.2 of this subtitle, a license expires on the date set by the Board, unless the license is renewed for an additional term as provided in this section. A license may not be renewed for a term longer than 2 years.

(b) At least 1 month before the license expires, the Board shall send to the licensee, by first class mail to the last known address given to the Board by the licensee, a renewal notice that states:

(1) The date on which the current license expires;

(2) The date by which the renewal application must be received by the Board for the renewal to be issued and mailed before the license expires; and

(3) The amount of the renewal fee.
