REGULATED BY THE BOARD, IN NEED OF TREATMENT AND REHABILITATION FOR ALCOHOLISM, DRUG ABUSE, CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY, OR OTHER PHYSICAL, EMOTIONAL, OR MENTAL CONDITION.

- (E) (1) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS SUBSECTION, THE PROCEEDINGS, RECORDS, AND FILES OF THE HEARING AID DEALER REHABILITATION COMMITTEE ARE NOT DISCOVERABLE AND ARE NOT ADMISSIBLE IN EVIDENCE IN ANY CIVIL ACTION ARISING OUT OF MATTERS THAT ARE BEING OR HAVE BEEN REVIEWED AND EVALUATED BY THE HEARING AID DEALER REHABILITATION COMMITTEE.
- (2) PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO ANY RECORD OR DOCUMENT THAT IS CONSIDERED BY THE HEARING AID DEALER REHABILITATION COMMITTEE AND THAT OTHERWISE WOULD BE SUBJECT TO DISCOVERY OR INTRODUCTION INTO EVIDENCE IN A CIVIL ACTION.
- (3) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SUBSECTION, CIVIL ACTION DOES NOT INCLUDE A PROCEEDING BEFORE THE BOARD OR JUDICIAL REVIEW OF A PROCEEDING BEFORE THE BOARD.
- (F) A PERSON WHO ACTS IN GOOD FAITH AND WITHIN THE SCOPE OF JURISDICTION OF A HEARING AID DEALER REHABILITATION COMMITTEE IS NOT CIVILLY LIABLE FOR ANY ACTION AS A MEMBER OF THE HEARING AID DEALER REHABILITATION COMMITTEE OR FOR GIVING INFORMATION TO, PARTICIPATING IN, OR CONTRIBUTING TO THE FUNCTION OF THE HEARING AID DEALER REHABILITATION COMMITTEE. 2-401.
- (a) Except as otherwise provided in this title, a person may not practice, attempt to practice, or offer to practice audiology, PROVIDE HEARING AID SERVICES, OR PRACTICE SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY in this State unless licensed to practice audiology, PROVIDE HEARING AID SERVICES, OR PRACTICE SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY by the Board.
- (b) A person may not use or attempt to use a license or a limited license that has been purchased, fraudulently obtained, counterfeited, or materially altered.

2-402.

- (a) Unless authorized to practice audiology under this title, a person may not represent to the public by title, by description of services, methods, or procedures, or otherwise that the person:
 - (1) Is authorized to practice audiology in this State; or
- (2) Evaluates, examines, directs, instructs, or counsels individuals suffering from disorders or conditions that affect hearing, or assists those individuals in the perception of sound.
