- (b) A paid police officer employed by an airport authority, a county, the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission, a municipality, or the State OR A MONTGOMERY COUNTY DEPUTY SHERIFF is presumed to be suffering from an occupational disease that was suffered in the line of duty and is compensable under this title if:
- (1) the police officer OR DEPUTY SHERIFF is suffering from heart disease or hypertension; and
- (2) the heart disease or hypertension results in partial or total disability or death.
- (d) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subtitle, any paid fire fighter, paid fire fighting instructor, [or] paid police officer, OR ANY MONTGOMERY COUNTY DEPUTY SHERIFF who is eligible for benefits under subsection (a), (b), or (c) of this section shall receive the benefits in addition to any benefits that the individual is entitled to receive under the retirement system in which the individual was a participant at the time of the claim.
- (2) The benefits received under this title shall be adjusted so that the weekly total of those benefits and retirement benefits does not exceed the weekly salary that was paid to the fire fighter, fire fighting instructor, [or] police officer, OR DEPUTY SHERIFF.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1992.
