CHAPTER 364

(House Bill 798)

AN ACT concerning

St. Mary's County - Clerk of the Circuit Court - Collection Fees

FOR the purpose of providing that, in St. Mary's County, the Clerk of the Circuit Court is not entitled to a collection fee for collecting the county transfer tax when the clerk collects both the recordation tax and the county transfer tax for the filing of a single instrument of writing.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 17 - Clerks of Courts

74.

- (A) For receiving, collecting and paying over all public money 5% except the clerk of the Circuit Court for Montgomery County, who shall receive 3% commission, provided that the clerk of the Circuit Court for Baltimore County and Anne Arundel County shall be entitled to receive 3% and the clerk of the Circuit Court for Baltimore City shall be entitled to receive 2 1/2% of the amount collected from the tax applicable to instruments recorded with the said respective clerks under Title 12 of the Tax Property Article, but shall be entitled to receive 5% for receiving, collecting and paying over all other public moneys. The clerk of the court for Harford County shall be entitled to receive 3% of the amount collected from the tax applicable to instruments recorded with the said clerk under Title 12 of the Tax Property Article but shall be entitled to receive 5% for receiving, collecting and paying over all other public moneys.
- (B) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, IN ST. MARY'S COUNTY, THE CLERK OF THE CIRCUIT COURT IS NOT ENTITLED TO A COLLECTION FEE FOR COLLECTING THE COUNTY TRANSFER TAX UNDER CHAPTER 138 OF THE PUBLIC LOCAL LAWS OF ST. MARY'S COUNTY
