SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of the Environment shall study and report on or before December 1, 1992 to the Governor and, subject to § 2 1312 of the State Government Article, to the House Environmental Matters Committee and the Senate Economic and Environmental Affairs Committee on appropriate statutory and regulatory changes to streamline solid waste management permitting processes for composting facilities in the State.

SECTION 5. 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on or before October 1, 1993 the Department of General Services, the Department of Transportation, the Maryland Transportation Authority, the University of Maryland System, the Maryland Port Commission, and the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services shall review their procurement specifications and practices and, to the extent practicable, incorporate the use of products containing compost in land maintenance and other appropriate activities.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That from the effective date of this Act through September 30, 1995, the regulations adopted under § 6-221 of the Agriculture Article, as enacted by this Act, may not apply to a recycling facility in this State for which financing is obtained through the Maryland Energy Financing Administration.

SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Sections 1, 3, 4, and 5 of this Act shall take effect October 1, 1992.

SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall take effect October 1, 1994.
