- (III) "PRISON FACILITY" MEANS ANY NEW STATE CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTION OF 1,000 BEDS OR MORE, CONSTRUCTED BY FOR THE DIVISION OF CORRECTION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES AFTER JANUARY 1, 1985.
- (2) IN A COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION FOR AN INITIAL APPOINTMENT TO ANY POSITION IN THE DIVISION OF CORRECTION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES A PRISON FACILITY, THE SECRETARY SHALL ALLOW 5 PREFERENCE POINTS TO EACH RESIDENT OF A HOST COUNTY THAT, IN THE PRECEDING 12-MONTH PERIOD FOR WHICH THE MOST RECENT DATA IS AVAILABLE AS REPORTED BY THE MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC AND EMPLOYMENT DEVELOPMENT, HAS AN AVERAGE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE THAT IS MORE THAN 1.5 TIMES THE STATE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE AS A WHOLE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1992. It shall remain effective for a period of 8 years, and at the end of September 30, 2000, and with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force or effect.
