SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 89 – Miscellaneous Business, Work, and Safety Provisions

It is the purpose of this subtitle to provide financial assistance for comprehensive job training and related services for economically disadvantaged, unemployed, and underemployed individuals through opportunities industrialization centers and other similar community based organizations.]

[11.

(a) In this subtitle, the following words have the meanings indicated.

(b) “Underemployed” means an individual:

(1) Working part time but seeking full-time work; or

(2) Working full time but receiving wages below the greater of:

(i) The poverty level determined in accordance with criteria established by the Department of Economic and Employment Development; or
