  - (2) Advise the Governor, the Secretary, and the Administration on:
- (i) Short and long term needs for services which the State Advisory Council has identified;
- (ii) Promoting and coordinating, in cooperation with other federal, State, local or private agencies, unified programs for education, prevention, diagnosis, treatment, rehabilitation, and control of alcohol abuse and drug abuse; and
- (iii) Reviewing existing programs and facilities of the Administration and short and long term plans [; and
- (3) Submit an annual report on its activities to the Governor and, subject to § 2-1312 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly].8-405.
- [(b) The Department shall report, subject to § 2-1312 of the State Government Article, to the Legislative Policy Committee by December 1st of each year concerning each alcohol abuse and drug abuse treatment program designed for residential living by 4 or more unrelated people proposed during the preceding year. This report shall discuss the following:
- (1) Whether the notification requirement has facilitated the establishment and maintenance of the program; and
- (2) The overall success or failure of establishing the program in the county or municipality.]
