

(ii) The recommendations on the inventory, study, plan, and regulation of the Secretary, any local governing body, or any local advisory board;

(2) [Recommend, subject to § 2-1312 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly:

(i) Plans for the management of resources of the rivers, shorelines, and related lands that are included in the Scenic and Wild Rivers Program; and

(ii) Studies for including additional rivers and tributaries in the Scenic and Wild Rivers Program;

(3)] Meet regularly; AND

[(4) Submit an annual report, subject to § 2-1312 of the State Government Article, to each member of the General Assembly; and

(5)] (3) Appoint, with the advice and consent of the appropriate local governing body, a local scenic and wild river advisory board for each river that is included in the Scenic and Wild Rivers Program.

[(d) The Department shall report every 2 years to the Governor and, subject to § 2-1312 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly on January 1 concerning the progress of the implementation of this subtitle. The report may contain recommendations for:

(1) Improvements to this subtitle;

(2) Actions needed to improve implementation of the subtitle; and

(3) Amendments to the flood hazard area maps.]

Chapter 703 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1988

[SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene report to the General Assembly by November 1, 1988 and each year thereafter on the number of private review agents conducting utilization review, and the type of criteria used to perform utilization review, the feasibility of adopting uniform standards for one or more aspects of utilization review including standardized forms for data collection and the medical procedures for which preauthorization and second surgical opinions would be required.]

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, has been passed by a ye and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
