- (5) A member may not be appointed for more than [two] 2 consecutive full terms.
- (6) TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE, THE GOVERNOR SHALL FILL ANY VACANCY ON THE BOARD WITHIN 60 DAYS OF THE DATE OF THE VACANCY.
- (i) (1) The Governor may remove a member for incompetence, misconduct, continued neglect of duties imposed by this subtitle, unprofessional conduct, or dishonorable conduct.
- (2) The Governor shall remove a member whom the Governor finds to have been absent from [two] 2 successive Board meetings without adequate reason.

- (g) <u>Hunless authorized by the Board, the consumer CONSUMER</u> members of the Board may not <u>ONLY</u> participate in any activity related to <u>THE PROCTORING OR MONITORING OF</u> examinations under this title.
- (h) Unless authorized by the Board, a dental hygienist member of the Board may not participate in any activity relating to the examination of dentists under this title. 5-202.
 - (c) (1) The term of a member is 3 years.
- (2) The terms of the members are staggered as required by the terms provided for members of the Board on July 1, 1985.
- (3) At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
- (4) A member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
