

(5) A member may not be appointed for more than [two] 2 consecutive full terms.

(6) TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE, THE GOVERNOR SHALL FILL ANY VACANCY ON THE BOARD WITHIN 60 DAYS OF THE DATE OF THE VACANCY.

(i) (1) The Governor may remove a member for incompetence, misconduct, continued neglect of duties imposed by this subtitle, unprofessional conduct, or dishonorable conduct.

(2) The Governor shall remove a member whom the Governor finds to have been absent from [two] 2 successive Board meetings without adequate reason.

(a) From among its members, the Board shall elect a president and a secretary.

[(b) The manner of election of officers and their terms of office shall be as the Board determines.

(c) The Board secretary is the legal custodian of all Board records and any other Board property.]

(B) THE BOARD SHALL DETERMINE:

(1) THE MANNER OF ELECTION OF OFFICERS;

(2) THE TERM OF OFFICE OF EACH OFFICER; AND

(3) THE DUTIES OF EACH OFFICER.

(c) (1) The term of a member is 3 years.

(2) The terms of the members are staggered as required by the terms provided for members of the Board on July 1, 1985.

(3) At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies.

(4) A member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
