

(2) UPON THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE SECRETARY, THE GOVERNOR MAY REMOVE A MEMBER WHOM THE SECRETARY FINDS TO HAVE BEEN ABSENT FROM 2 SUCCESSIVE BOARD MEETINGS WITHOUT ADEQUATE REASON.

(a) From among its members, the Board annually shall elect a chairman.

[(b) The manner of election of officers shall be as the Board determines.]

(B) THE BOARD SHALL DETERMINE:

(1) THE MANNER OF ELECTION OF OFFICERS; AND

(2) THE DUTIES OF EACH OFFICER.

CHAPTER 434

(House Bill 56)

AN ACT concerning

Health Occupations – Board Membership – Term Limitations

FOR the purpose of specifying that the members of certain health occupation boards may not serve more than 2 consecutive full terms; changing the tenure of the members of certain boards; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to the terms of certain health occupation board members.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
