- (5) (9) THE RESOLUTION OF INTERJURISDICTIONAL CONFLICTS CONCERNING LAND USE DEVELOPMENT; AND
- (6) (10) CONSISTENT WITH THE STATE ECONOMIC GROWTH, RESOURCE PROTECTION, AND PLANNING POLICY, RECOMMENDATIONS FOR COORDINATION AND IMPLEMENTATION OF FUNDING MECHANISMS AND OTHER STATE ASSISTANCE FOR PLANNING ACTIVITIES AND INFRASTRUCTURE NEEDS, INCLUDING THOSE IDENTIFIED BY LOCAL JURISDICTIONS IN REVIEWING COMPREHENSIVE PLANS UNDER ARTICLE 66B, §§ 3.05(B) AND 3.06(B) OF THE CODE;
- (11) THE PROGRESS OF LOCAL GOVERNMENTS IN DIRECTING GROWTH AND MANAGING OR PROTECTING NATURAL RESOURCES; AND
- (12) POPULATION PROJECTIONS AND RELATED PROJECTIONS FOR LAND CONVERSION AND THEIR IMPACT ON THE STATE'S LAND AND WATER RESOURCES.
- (B) (1) BY DECEMBER 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE COMMISSION SHALL PREPARE AND SUBMIT AN ANNUAL REPORT THAT:
- (1) DESCRIBES STATE, REGIONAL, AND LOCAL STRENGTHS AND WEAKNESSES RELATED TO THE STATE'S ECONOMIC GROWTH AND RESOURCE, RESOURCE PROTECTION, AND PLANNING POLICY, INCLUDING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF LOCAL PLANS AND THE ITEMS LISTED IN SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION—; AND
- (2) THE COMMISSION SHALL SUBMIT ITS ANNUAL REPORT ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1 OF EACH YEAR.

(2) INCLUDES:

- (I) RECOMMENDATIONS, IF ANY, MADE BY THE COMMISSION UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION; AND
- (II) SUGGESTED POLICY CHANGES OR LEGISLATION, IF ANY, THAT THE COMMISSION BELIEVES IS NECESSARY TO ACHIEVE:
- 1. THE STATE'S ECONOMIC GROWTH, RESOURCE PROTECTION, AND PLANNING POLICY AND CONSISTENCY OF THE STATE'S PROGRAMS WITH THAT POLICY;
- <u>2. IMPLEMENTATION OF LOCAL COMPREHENSIVE</u> PLANS;
- 3. THE PROTECTION OF SENSITIVE AREAS UNDER ARTICLE 66B, § 3.05(A)(1)(VIII) OF THE CODE;
- 4. THE ATTAINMENT OF THE VISIONS UNDER ARTICLE 66B, § 3.06 OF THE CODE; AND
