

~~(i) (1) On request, the dealer shall permit any law enforcement officer authorized to act in the jurisdiction to enter the dealer's business or storage premises during business hours pursuant to a stolen property investigation to inspect records and precious metals.~~

~~(2) If the dealer so requests, inspections shall be in the presence of the dealer or the dealer's agent.~~

~~(3) If a dealer refuses to permit access or to produce records or items for inspection, the law enforcement officer shall obtain a search warrant.~~

~~A dealer may not purchase or acquire precious metals, OR TAKE ANY MERCHANDISE IN A PAWN TRANSACTION, from an individual under 18 years old.~~
