CHAPTER 466

(Senate Bill 317)

AN ACT concerning

Real Estate Brokers - Licensing Exception

FOR the purpose of extending an exception from real estate broker licensing requirements to affiliates and subsidiaries of certain financial institutions; adding leasing to the activities allowed for certain institutions that are not required to obtain real estate broker licenses; adding certain items to the list of conveyances with which certain unlicensed institutions manage, sell, or lease property; and generally relating to exceptions from real estate broker licensing requirements.
