

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1992. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and at the end of May 31, 1995, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

CHAPTER 496

(Senate Bill 596)

AN ACT concerning

Transient Vendors – Licenses

FOR the purpose of requiring certain transient vendors in the State to obtain a license before conducting business in the State; providing that a transient vendor's license shall be ~~renewed annually~~ valid for a certain period; defining a certain term; requiring a transient vendor to ~~keep the license in its possession and to exhibit the license upon request of a law enforcement officer~~ display the license at the vendor's transient location; ~~requiring~~ authorizing the Comptroller to require a transient vendor to notify the Comptroller before entering the State of certain intentions of the vendor; requiring a transient vendor to permit the Comptroller to inspect certain records and certain goods; authorizing the Comptroller to revoke a transient vendor's license under certain circumstances; authorizing a law enforcement officer to order a stop sale under certain circumstances or seize certain property under certain circumstances and providing for the forfeiture of certain property under certain circumstances; requiring the Comptroller to adopt certain regulations; imposing certain criminal penalties for certain violations of the provisions of this Act; and generally relating to the regulation of certain transient vendors in the State.

Annotated Code of Maryland

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
