

(C) (1) PRIZES MAY BE AWARDED TO INDIVIDUALS AT A GAMING EVENT, BUT ONLY 1 MAJOR PRIZE MAY BE AWARDED AT EACH GAMING EVENT.

(2) DURING EACH CALENDAR YEAR AN ORGANIZATION MAY NOT HOLD OR RECEIVE THE PROCEEDS FROM:

(I) MORE THAN 1 GAMING EVENT IN WHICH THE MAJOR PRIZE IS VALUED AT \$5,000 OR MORE; AND

(II) MORE THAN 5 ~~GAMING EVENTS~~ RAFFLES IN WHICH THE MAJOR PRIZE IS VALUED AT \$5,000 OR LESS.

(3) BEFORE OPERATING ANY GAMING EVENT, THE ORGANIZATION SHALL OBTAIN A PERMIT FROM THE COUNTY AGENCY CHOSEN BY THE BOARD. THE GAMING EVENT MAY BE MANAGED AND OPERATED ONLY BY MEMBERS OF THE PERMIT HOLDER. THE PERMIT IS VALID FOR 1 YEAR AND IS NOT TRANSFERABLE.

(D) (1) BEFORE ISSUING A PERMIT, THE COUNTY AGENCY SHALL ASCERTAIN THE CHARACTER OF THE ORGANIZATION FOR WHOM THE APPLICATION IS MADE TO DETERMINE IF THE APPLICATION MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.

(2) THE APPLICATION AND THE ACTION THAT THE COUNTY AGENCY TAKES ARE ~~PUBLIC~~ MATTERS OF PUBLIC RECORD.

(3) THE PERMIT AUTHORIZES THE OPERATION OF A GAMING EVENT AFTER 1 P.M. ON SUNDAY.

(4) THE BOARD MAY CHARGE AN ISSUANCE FEE AND ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS SECTION.

(E) A PERSON MAY ONLY OPERATE TIP JARS OR PUNCHBOARDS WITHIN THE COUNTY IF:

(1) THE TIP JAR OR PUNCHBOARD IS OPERATED FOR AN ORGANIZATION THAT IS:

(I) A BONA FIDE RELIGIOUS, FRATERNAL, CIVIC, WAR VETERANS' HOSPITAL, AMATEUR ATHLETIC, PATRIOTIC, EDUCATIONAL, OR CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION THAT IS IN THE COUNTY; OR

(II) A VOLUNTEER FIRE, RESCUE, OR AMBULANCE COMPANY OF THE COUNTY OR ITS AUXILIARY;

(2) THE OPERATOR IS AN ESTABLISHMENT OR PROPRIETOR LICENSED TO SERVE FOOD ~~OR~~ AND ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES FOR CONSUMPTION ON THE PREMISES;
