~~(M) (1) IF THE COMMISSION DOES NOT RECEIVE AN OBJECTION WITHIN 3 BUSINESS DAYS AFTER THE RESULT OF THE ELECTION IS ANNOUNCED, THE MONEY HELD IN ESCROW SHALL BE RELEASED TO THE ORGANIZATION THAT WINS THE ELECTION.~~

~~(2) IF THE COMMISSION RECEIVES A TIMELY OBJECTION, THE COMMISSION MAY ORDER THAT THE MONEY CONTINUE TO BE HELD IN ESCROW UNTIL THE COMMISSION RULES ON THE OBJECTION.~~

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(e) (1) Intertrack betting may be held only if the organizations specified in this subsection approve the agreement between the receiving track and the sending track to simulcast races.

(2) If the sending track is a mile thoroughbred track, approval shall be by an organization representing:

(i) a majority of the owners and trainers at the sending track; and
