

[(d)](E) If a covered employee is awarded compensation for less than 75 weeks for a disability listed in § 9-627(b) of this subtitle, the employer or its insurer shall pay the covered employee weekly compensation at the rate set for an award of compensation for a period greater than or equal to 75 weeks but less than 250 weeks under § 9-629 of this subtitle.

[(e)](F) If a public safety employee is awarded compensation for less than 75 weeks, the employer or its insurer shall pay the public safety employee compensation at the rate set for an award of compensation for a period greater than or equal to 75 weeks but less than 250 weeks under § 9-629 of this subtitle.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1992.

CHAPTER 547

(House Bill 565)

AN ACT concerning

Certificate of Death – Correction – Contested Case Hearings

FOR the purpose of authorizing certain individuals and family members of a deceased individual to request correction of a certificate of death under certain circumstances; providing that certain requests for correction are subject to the contested case hearing provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act; requiring a contested case hearing to be conducted under certain circumstances; providing certain appeal rights under certain circumstances; requiring amendment of a certificate of death under certain circumstances; prohibiting certain decisions from establishing certain presumptions; providing for the payment of the costs of a contested case hearing; defining a term; requiring the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner to adopt certain regulations implementing this Act by a certain date; providing for the application of this Act; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally relating to certificates of death and contested case hearings.
