

For any conviction or convictions under this section subsequent to the second, the person shall be fined on each occasion a sum of at least double that imposed upon him, her, them or it on the last preceding conviction. A natural person shall be imprisoned not less than 30 nor more than 60 days. All fines to be imposed under this section shall be paid to the State. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary the provisions of this section do not apply:

(1) To any person who conscientiously believes that the seventh day of the week ought to be observed as the Sabbath and who actually refrains from secular business and labor on that day, and whose business establishment or establishments or employer's business establishment or establishments (whether a sole proprietorship, partnership or corporation) are actually closed on that day; or

(2) To any person who conscientiously believes that the Sabbath begins at sundown on Friday night and ends at sundown on Saturday night and who actually refrains from secular business and labor during that period, and whose business establishment or establishments or employer's business establishment or establishments (whether a sole proprietorship, partnership or corporation) are actually closed during such period.]
