- (32) FAILS TO <u>BEGIN TO</u> FULFILL A PUBLIC SERVICE REQUIREMENT <u>WITHIN 1 YEAR OF WHEN THE ASSIGNMENT IS TO BEGIN</u> THAT WAS A CONDITION OF THE LICENSEE RECEIVING STATE OR FEDERAL LOANS OR SCHOLARSHIPS FOR THE LICENSEE'S MEDICAL EDUCATION.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if the voters affirm Section 1 of the Laws of Maryland of 1991 by referendum, the provisions of Section 1 of this Act affecting § 14–404 of the Health Occupations Article shall be effective and the provisions of Section 2 shall be null and void without the necessity of further action by the General Assembly.
- SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if the voters reject Chapter 1 of the Laws of Maryland of 1991 by referendum the provisions of Section 2 shall be effective and the provisions of Section 1 of this Act affecting § 14–404 of the Health Occupations Article shall be null and void without the necessity of further action by the General Assembly.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1992.

(House Bill 1005)

Pensions - Accidental Disability - Limit on Filing
