

(F) POSTING OF CERTIFICATE.

EACH REGISTRANT SHALL DISPLAY THE CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION CONSPICUOUSLY IN EACH LOCATION WHERE THE REGISTRANT STORES OR SELLS MOTOR FUEL.

(G) REGISTRATION NOT TRANSFERABLE.

A CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION ISSUED UNDER THIS TITLE IS NOT TRANSFERABLE.

(H) WAIVER OF SECTION.

THE COMPTROLLER MAY WAIVE THIS SECTION ONLY WHEN CONSUMERS IN THE STATE OTHERWISE WOULD BE SUBJECT TO EXTREME HARDSHIP DURING AN EMERGENCY OR CIVIL DISTURBANCE.

REVISOR'S NOTE: Subsections (a), (b), (c), (d)(2), (e), (f), (g), and (h) of this section are new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 56, § 157F(e) and the first through fifth sentences of (a)(1) and the second sentence of § 157E(a).

Subsection (d)(1) of this section is standard language added for clarity.

In subsection (a) of this section, the phrase "in the State" is added for clarity.

Also in subsection (a) of this section, the words "person or governmental unit" are substituted for the former words "motor fuel wholesaler", "special fuel seller", "manufacturer", "refiner", "marina", "distributor", "special fuel retailer", "terminal operator", and "retail service station dealer" for brevity.

In the introductory language of subsection (c) of this section, the reference to "the form that the Comptroller requires" is standard language added to state expressly that which only was implied in the former law; i.e., applications may be made only in the form that the Comptroller requires.

In subsection (c)(1), (3), and (7) of this section, the words "store" or "stored" are added to reflect that a person or governmental unit that stores as well as sells motor fuel must register with the Comptroller.

In subsection (c)(1) of this section, the words "under whatever name designated for power and heating purposes" are deleted as surplusage.

In subsection (c)(5) of this section, the phrase "if applicable" is added to take into account those persons or governmental units for whom the requirement of subsection (c)(5) of this section would not apply.

Subsection (f) of this section is revised in standard language.

In subsection (h) of this section, the word "otherwise" is added to clarify that if a waiver is not authorized, consumers would be subject to extreme hardship.
