- (A) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH A CONSOLIDATED SENIOR SPORT FISHING LICENSE, TO BE ISSUED TO INDIVIDUALS AT LEAST 65 YEARS OLD.

- (C) A CONSOLIDATED SENIOR SPORT FISHING LICENSE SHALL BE VALID FOR NOT MORE THAN 1 YEAR AND SHALL EXPIRE ON DECEMBER 31.
- (D) A HOLDER OF A CONSOLIDATED SENIOR SPORT FISHING LICENSE MAY:
- (1) ENGAGE IN ANGLING ON THE NONTIDAL WATERS OF THE STATE WITHOUT HOLDING AN ANGLER'S LICENSE UNDER § 4–504 OF THIS TITLE;
