

- (II) STATES THE UNIT OF MEASUREMENT USED; AND
- (III) IS READABLE BY PASSING MOTORISTS.

(3) ALL NUMERALS ON THE SIGN SHALL:

- (I) BE UNIFORM;
- (II) BE AT LEAST 8 INCHES HIGH AND 3.5 INCHES WIDE;

AND

- (III) HAVE A BRUSH STROKE OF AT LEAST 1 INCH.

(4) A NUMERAL IN A FRACTION OR A LETTER SHALL BE AT LEAST ONE-THIRD THE HEIGHT OF A NUMERAL THAT INDICATES A WHOLE NUMBER.

(5) IF A NEW OR ADDITIONAL SIGN IS REQUIRED TO COMPLY WITH THIS SUBSECTION, THE SUPPLIER OF THE GASOLINE SHALL PROVIDE THE SIGN AND NUMERALS WITHOUT COST TO THE RETAIL SERVICE STATION DEALER.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived without substantive change from former Art. 56, § 157J.

In subsection (a) of this section, the former phrase "at all times" is deleted as surplusage.

In subsection (b)(2) of this section, the phrase "if numerals that show a fractional cent" is substituted for the former phrase "where fractional cents or figures are used" for clarity.

In the introductory language of subsection (c)(1) of this section, the former word "placard" is deleted as unnecessary in light of the word "sign".

In subsection (d)(1)(i) of this section, the phrase "dispensing units" is substituted for the former phrase "pump housings" to conform to the language of this section.

In subsection (d)(2)(iii) of this section, the former reference to the requirement that a sign be "located" so as to be readable is deleted as surplusage.

In subsection (d)(4) of this section, the disjunctive "or" is substituted for the former conjunctive "and" to clarify that the size requirement must be met individually by a numeral in a fraction or by a letter.

In subsection (d)(5) of this section, the defined term "gasoline" is substituted for the former word "fuel" for clarity.
