- 2. AT LEAST 1 OF THE LICENSEES IS A RESIDENT OPERATOR OF THE BUSINESS CONDUCTED ON THE LICENSED PREMISES AND THAT SAME INDIVIDUAL IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DAY TO DAY OPERATION OF THE LICENSE;
- 3. ALL LICENSEES, INCLUDING THE RESIDENT APPLICANT, ARE NAMED OFFICERS OF THE CORPORATION; AND
- 4. THE RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT IN EFFECT AT THE TIME THE LICENSE IS ISSUED REMAINS IN EFFECT AS LONG AS THE LICENSE IS IN EFFECT.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1992.

CHAPTER 627

(House Bill 1482)

AN ACT concerning

Harford County - Alcoholic Beverages Licensees

(Prohibition on Sales to Minors and Intoxicated Persons Age Identification)

FOR the purpose of including providing that in Harford County among those jurisdictions in which it is not a violation for an alcoholic beverage licensee who serves to serve an underage person is not guilty if the licensee used due caution to establish the age of the underaged underage person; deleting Harford County from those jurisdictions in which such a showing of due caution is not admissible; and clarifying language.
