AN ACT concerning

Public Service Commission – Directory Assistance

FOR the purpose of altering the number of directory assistance calls made by residential customers for which telephone companies are prohibited from levying charges; requiring the Public Service Commission to adjust certain residential telephone rates to provide certain income to telephone companies; ~~specifying that the Commission may not authorize telephone companies to charge for certain directory assistance calls; making stylistic changes; providing for the effective date of certain sections of this Act;~~ and generally relating to calls for directory assistance made to telephone companies.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 78 – Public Service Commission Law

(b) (1) The Commission may not authorize telephone company charges to be levied for directory assistance calls made by residential customers upon the first [12] ~~5~~ 6 calls made to directory assistance from each residential service per monthly billing cycle.

(2) IN ORDER TO DETERMINE JUST AND REASONABLE RATES FOR RESIDENTIAL TELEPHONE SERVICE, THE COMMISSION SHALL ADJUST THE RESIDENTIAL TELEPHONE RATES OF A TELEPHONE COMPANY THAT IT CONSIDERS APPROPRIATE TO PROVIDE THE SAME NET
