CHAPTER 642

(House Bill 838)

AN ACT concerning

Solicitation of Elderly Persons Maryland Door-To-Door Solicitations Act

FOR the purpose of regulating the solicitation of certain persons after certain hours of the day for nonpolitical and noncharitable purposes; providing definitions; providing for the filing of certain documents with the Secretary of State; providing for a fee; providing for the rescission of certain transactions; providing for the notification of certain individuals under certain circumstances; establishing requirements for organizations conducting elderly solicitation; providing for the filing of a bond by certain organizations; providing penalties; providing procedures for the Secretary of State and the Attorney General; and generally relating to the solicitation of elderly persons for goods and services, by certain persons at the residence of a consumer; requiring a solicitor to provide the consumer with a pledge form under certain circumstances; providing that the pledge form must contain certain information; providing that a consumer may rescind a pledge made pursuant to a door-to-door solicitation under certain circumstances; providing for the enforceability of the pledge under certain circumstances; providing that a payment, pledge, or promise made in violation of this Act is voidable; providing that a violation of this Act is an unfair and deceptive trade practice; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the rights and responsibilities of solicitors and consumers in door-to-door solicitations.
