(III) PROCEDURES TO ACCOUNT FOR ANY HUMAN REMAINS AND ASSOCIATED FUNERARY OBJECTS THAT ARE TRANSFERRED ON A TEMPORARY BASIS FOR STUDY TO A MUSEUM, INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION, OR RECOGNIZED SCIENTIFIC OR HISTORICAL INSTITUTION OR ORGANIZATION.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1992.

## **CHAPTER 646**

(House Bill 1242)

AN ACT concerning

## Major Medical Equipment

FOR the purpose of eliminating the termination date and continuing the licensure program for major medical equipment in the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene; altering the major medical equipment licensure program; specifying the equipment to be licensed; specifying the equipment to be licensed; specifying the Secretary to set certain fees; eliminating a certain requirement for certain regulations and authorizing the Secretary to require certain reporting of licensees; providing the Secretary with access to certain locations and records to determine compliance with certain requirements under certain circumstances; authorizing the Secretary of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to issue a provisional license to impose restrictions and conditions on certain licensees under certain circumstances; authorizing the Secretary to impose certain administrative penalties; requiring the Secretary to adopt certain regulations; altering certain definitions; requiring the Secretary to require certain persons to submit an annual report containing certain information; requiring the Secretary to report to a certain Committee; and generally relating to the major medical equipment licensure program.
