

- (3) the average charge per treatment for patients in each payor class;
 (4) the average number of treatments or visits by patients in each payor class;

and

- (5) the total number of patients referred for treatment by each physician.

On or before January 1, 1994 and January 1, 1995, the Secretary shall submit a report to the Joint Committee on Health Care Delivery and Financing which summarizes the information submitted under this section. When submitting the report to the Joint Committee, the Secretary shall assign each referring physician a universal identifying number or code and may not disclose the names of the referring physicians.

SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1992.

CHAPTER 647

(House Bill 1319)

AN ACT concerning

Hazardous Materials ~~Bulk Storage and~~ Transfer – Permits

FOR the purpose of establishing a permit requirement for certain facilities in the State that ~~store or~~ transfer certain hazardous materials; authorizing the Secretary of the Environment to adopt certain regulations, establish certain fees, and require certain applications; providing certain standards for fee setting; authorizing the Department of the Environment to set the term of a permit; providing for certain ~~hearings~~ public informational meetings; providing standards for maintenance of permits; providing for inspections, enforcement, and penalties relating to the provisions of this subtitle; exempting certain facilities; providing for the denial and renewal of permits under certain circumstances; providing for the disposition of certain funds collected under this Act; prohibiting certain actions; and generally relating to the regulation of hazardous materials.
