- (8) 3 local superintendents or their designees, provided that every region of the State is represented; and
  - (9) 2 members from the public at large; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Governor designate the chairman of the Task Force; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the staffing of the Task Force shall be provided by the Department of Fiscal Services and the Interagency Committee on School Construction; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the purpose of the Task Force is to:

- (1) Examine the needs for public school construction, including new schools and additions and/or renovations to existing schools, through the year 2000;
  - (2) Develop funding mechanisms to address these needs; and
- (3) To examine and develop funding mechanisms for those projects that have been forward funded by the counties and, according to State law and regulations, are eligible for reimbursement by the State; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, subject to § 2-1312 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly by November 1, 1992; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of Legislative Reference to the Honorable William Donald Schaefer, Governor of Maryland; the Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; and the Honorable R. Clayton Mitchell, Jr., Speaker of the House of Delegates.
