

WHEREAS, The Governor and the Legislative Leadership have agreed that the budget crisis and the impact on the preparation of the fiscal 1993 budget have made it impossible for the Governor to meet the deadline specified in the Constitution for the submission of the budget and have further agreed that the budget bill and the supporting documents should be available on January 31, 1992; and

WHEREAS, Section 52(3) of Article III of the Maryland Constitution provides that the time for submission of the budget may be extended by the General Assembly; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the date for submission of the fiscal 1993 budget, including the budget bill and supporting documents, is extended until January 31, 1992; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Governor is requested to permit the cabinet secretaries and heads of agencies to discuss agency budget concerns as part of presentations or meetings with the Legislature or legislative committees prior to the date on which the fiscal 1993 budget is formally presented to the General Assembly; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of Legislative Reference to the Honorable Governor William Donald Schaefer, Governor of Maryland; Charles L. Benton, Secretary of Budget and Fiscal Planning; and William S. Ratchford II, Director of the Department of Fiscal Services.

Joint Resolution No. 9

(Senate Joint Resolution No. 3)

A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

Legislative Districting Plan of 1992

FOR the purpose of establishing a plan for legislative districts presented by the Governor pursuant to Article III, Section 5, of the Constitution of Maryland; providing that this Joint Resolution shall be effective as a plan within the meaning of Article III, Section 5, of the Constitution of Maryland only under certain circumstances; providing that this Joint Resolution does not preclude the enactment by the General Assembly of a subsequent Joint Resolution setting forth the boundaries of legislative districts; and generally relating to the establishment of legislative districts pursuant to Article III of the Constitution of Maryland.
