This bill would place the commissioners of the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission, the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission, and the Washington Suburban Transit Commission under the jurisdiction of the State Ethics Commission.

House Bill 1329, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 12, 1992, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 26.
