of the Washington Suburban Transit Commission and, upon issuance of a mandatory injunction against a commissioner pursuant to Title 7, the appropriate bicounty commission shall suspend payment of any salary or other compensation to the commissioner pending full compliance with the terms of the injunction.

(b) (1) This subsection applies to employees of the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission, the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission, and the Washington Suburban Transit Commission.

(2) Each commission shall:

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- (i) Adopt regulations relating to financial disclosure by employees of that commission; and
- (ii) File the regulations, and amendments to them, with the State Ethics Commission and with the governing body of each county in which the commission conducts its operations.
 - (3) The regulations required by this subsection:
- (i) Shall be substantially similar to the general financial disclosure provisions of Title 4 of this article; and
- (ii) May not conflict with the financial disclosure provisions of this section.
- (4) The regulations required by this subsection shall be adopted, after public hearing, by December 1, 1982.
- (a) This subtitle applies to the [commissioners and] employees of the Maryland National Capital Park and Planning Commission, the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission, and the Washington Suburban Transit Commission.
 - (b) (1) Each commission specified in subsection (a) shall:
- {(1)}(I) Promulgate rules and regulations relating to lobbying in that bicounty commission, which shall be filed with the State Ethics Commission; and
- **[(2)](II)** Prepare an annual report concerning the lobbying activities and regulations in the commission for that year. The report shall be submitted to the governing body of each county in which the commission conducts its operations.
- [(3)](2) At a minimum, the standards of State law governing lobbying as codified in this article, apply to lobbying, in the commission.
- (c) The rules and regulations required by this subsection shall be promulgated and adopted, after public hearing, no later than December 1, 1981.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1992.
