**Senate Bill No. 27**

AN ACT concerning

**Dorchester County – Micro–Brewery License Issuance – ~~Extension~~ Repeal of Termination Date**

FOR the purpose of ~~extending~~ repealing the termination date for provisions relating to the issuance of a micro–brewery (on– and off–sale) license in Dorchester County; and providing for the effective date of this Act.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,  
 Chapter 475 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1989  
 Section 2

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

**Chapter 475 of the Acts of 1989**

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the changes to Article 2B, Section 5(a) and (i)(1) relating to the issuance of a micro–brewery (on– and off–sale) license in Dorchester County shall take effect July 1, 1989. ~~These changes shall remain effective for a period of [three] 6 years and, at the end of June 30, [1992] 1995, and with no further action required by the General Assembly, these changes shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
