In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 236.

This bill would require off-sale alcoholic beverages licensees to complete an alcohol awareness program certified by the State Comptroller.

House Bill 386, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 12, 1992, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 236.

**Senate Bill No. 236**

AN ACT concerning

**Alcoholic Beverages – Alcohol Awareness Program**

FOR the purpose of requiring off-sale alcoholic beverages licensees to complete ~~an alcoholic a certain~~ an alcohol awareness program certified by the State Comptroller in conjunction with the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Administration; including a certain additional instruction required to be included in the program; providing for a recertification of the program by the State Comptroller under certain circumstances; providing for the implementation of this Act; and relating generally to the applicability of the alcohol awareness program for certain holders of alcoholic beverages licenses.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,  
 Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages  
 Section 130A  
 Annotated Code of Maryland  
 (1990 Replacement Volume and 1991 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
