agreements. Therefore, I am unclear as to what actual effect the bill would have other than perhaps to discourage infertile couples from pursuing the option that surrogacy provides. The creation of a family is a personal decision I think best left to the individuals involved.

For these reasons, I have vetoed Senate Bill 251.

AN ACT concerning

Commercial Surrogate Mother Agreements Parentage Contracts

FOR the purpose of establishing that a surrogate mother agreement that requires the exchange of consideration is void and against public policy; prohibiting a person from procuring, acting as an agent for, facilitating, or assisting in the carrying-out of a surrogate mother agreement for consideration; prohibiting the enforcement of certain surrogate mother agreements in a court of the State; establishing certain penalties for violation of this Act; defining certain terms; providing that provisions of this Act are severable; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally relating to surrogate mother agreements parentage contract is void and unenforceable as against State policy.
