

(1) Compensation, at a rate determined by the Board, for each day on which the member is engaged in the duties of the member's office; and

(2) Reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations.

(d) The Board may employ a staff in accordance with the State budget.

2-205.

(A) In addition to the powers and duties set forth elsewhere in this title, the Board has the following powers and duties:

(1) To adopt rules and regulations to carry out the provisions of this title;

(2) To adopt and publish [a code] CODES of ethics for the practice of audiology, THE PROVISION OF HEARING AID SERVICES, AND THE PRACTICE OF SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY;

(3) To adopt an official seal;

(4) To hold hearings and keep records and minutes necessary for the orderly conduct of business;

(5) To issue a list annually of the names of all individuals licensed by the Board to practice audiology, PROVIDE HEARING AID SERVICES, AND PRACTICE SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY; and

(6) To send any notice that the Board is required to give to a licensee under this title to the last known address given to the Board by the licensee.

(B) THE BOARD SHALL REQUIRE, BY REGULATION, PERIODIC CALIBRATION OF AUDIOMETRIC EQUIPMENT USED BY LICENSED AUDIOLOGISTS AND HEARING AID DEALERS.

(C) THE BOARD MAY INSPECT THE FACILITIES USED BY LICENSED HEARING AID DEALERS.

2-206.

(a) (1) The Board shall set reasonable fees for the issuance and renewal of licenses and its other services.

(2) The fees charged shall be set so as to produce funds to approximate the cost of maintaining the Board.

(b) [(1)]In accordance with the State budget, the Board may pay expenses incurred in carrying out the provisions of this title.

[(2) The expenses of the Board and the State Board of Examiners for Speech Pathologists shall be consolidated as a single item in the State budget.]

(c) The Board shall pay all funds collected under this title into the General Fund of this State.
